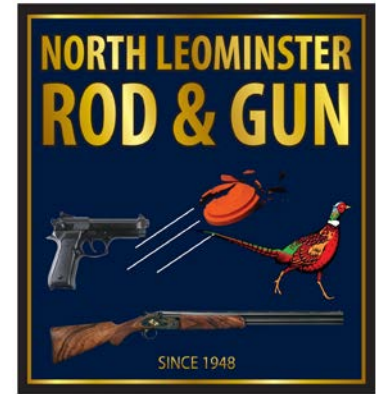
Other points of interest, Meagan Wyson shot a score of 97 for the first 100 of 200 hundred in the 200 Singles Event.
